


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# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**


This executive summary identifies some of the changes, trends or patterns over the past five years. The 2011-2012 total enrollment (Part 1A) of 2974

The number of students enrolled in the special education program has declined gradually over the past four years, with a decline from 369 in 2010-11 to 354 in 2011-12. In 2011-12, all of the departments showed a slight increase in the number of semester one sections offered (Part 2B).

Figures 2 and 3 provide graphs of enrollments by race as well as special education enrollments over the past five years.




